Quote from *Dog Training for Dummies*, by Jack and Wendy Volhard

The 'Pack Drive' consists of behaviors associated with reproduction, being part of a group or pack, and being able to live by the rules. Dogs are social animals that evolved from the wolf. To hunt prey, that is mostly larger than themselves, wolves have to live in a pack. To assure order, they have to adhere to a social hierarchy governed by strict rules of behavior. An ability to be part of a group and to fit in is important, and, in the dog, is translated into a willingness to work with us as part of a team. We can all apply this directly to our 'pack'.
